CAPTIONS OF THE LAWS.

Passed by the General Assembly of North Carolina, at the Session of 1854—55.

An act to establish Sucklandsville, Duplin county.

An act to prevent the felling of timber in the North East river, Duplin county.

An act to amend the eighth section of the sixteenth chapter of the Revised Code, entitled inspections.

An act relating to the Fayetteville and Warsaw plank road company.

[Appropriates ten thousand dollars for that portion of the road commencing at Warsaw.]

An act to incorporate the Wilmington Saving's Bank.

An act to permit the exportation of Oysters under certain circumstances.

An act to amend an act passed in 1852, concerning the place of trial for civil process, returnable before justices of the peace.

An act to incorporate the Atlantic, Tennessee and Ohio railroad company.

An act supplemental to and amendatory of an act of 1852, to bring into market the lands pledged for the completion of the Western turnpike road.

An act to increase the pay of jurors, in New Hanover, Brunswick, Pasquotank, Rowan, and Cleaveston.

An act to incorporate the Rutherford and McDowell plank road and turnpike company.

An act to incorporate the New River and Wilmington and Topsail Sound plank road company.

An act concerning the Wilmington and Raleigh railroad company.

An act for completing, furnishing and enclosing the buildings and grounds of the Lunatic Asylum.

An act to incorporate the Pasquotank and Perquimans plank road and turnpike company.

An act to incorporate the Warrenton plank road company.

An act to incorporate a company to construct a railroad from some point on the waters of Fayetteville, through the counties of Carteret, Onslow, Duplin, Sampson and Cumberland.

[No State aid extended.]

An act more effectually to secure a compliance with the terms of their charters, by the Banks chartered at the present session of the General Assembly, or that may hereafter be chartered in this State.

An act to incorporate the *Iron* of White Hall.

An act to increase the capital stock of the Commercial Bank, Wilmington.

An act to incorporate Cape Fear Academy.

An act to incorporate the Consolidated mining company of North Carolina.

An act for the better regulation of seamen in the town of Wilmington.

An act explanatory and amendatory of the act passed at the present session of the General Assembly, entitled "an act concerning Revenue."

[Provides for including in the tax on polls and real estate, the tax heretofore imposed for the State Asylum for the insane.]

An act to incorporate Brunswick Savings institute.

An act to incorporate the Wilmington and Smithville steam boat company.

An act to incorporate Franklin Male and Female Institute in the town of Franklin.

An act to establish a library of documents for each house of the General Assembly.

An act to incorporate the Keowa turnpike company.

An act to incorporate the Mineral plank road company.

An act to incorporate the Rocky Mount and Franklin plank road company.

An act in relation to deeds of which the registered copies have been burned or destroyed.

An act to amend an act incorporating the Tuckasegee and Keowa turnpike company in the county of Jackson.

[Appropriates the land in Jackson county to the use of the road.]

An act to give a right of action in certain cases where death is caused by neglect, default, or wrongful act.

An act relating to roads, bridges, fences, &c.

An act in relation to the Superior Courts of this State.

An act to amend an act exempting persons residing on the banks and islands between whalebone inlet and Cape Hatteras from serving as Jurors.

An act to encourage Agriculture and other purposes.

[Makes an annual appropriation of fifteen hundred dollars to the State Agricultural Society.]

An act to incorporate a company to construct a bridge across the Tennessee river.

An act to provide for the transmission to the persons of color now in Liberia the funds belonging to them in this State.

An act to authorize the Board of Literature to appoint an agent to superintend and supervise the Swamp Lands, &c.—Salary not to exceed one thousand dollars.

An act to code to the United States a tract of land near Wilmington.

An act to incorporate the Salem, Winston and Virginia Turnpike company.

An act to incorporate the Lockville and Cumberland Plankroad company.

An act to incorporate the Greensborough and Martin's Lumber company.

An act to amend the act of 1848—9, providing for a road from Salisbury west to the Georgia line.
