The contributions were greatly en hanced in value by the generous manner in which they were bestowed. I was received very cordially in both cities, and shall ever remember the many acts of kindness to me personally, and the manifestations of a genuine, disinterested benevolence, and hearttelt appreciation of our cause. 3. Visits to Literary Institutions of our State Several Institutions of the State are pledged to turnish rooms in the Home ; and we purpose having the name of each Institution inscribed on the room or rooms furnished by them, on account of its moral effect on seamen, and to perpetuate their interests in the flome. It will tend to destroy the impression among scamen that landsmen are indifferent to their spiritual interests. Such a manifestation of interest, on the part of young ladies especially, will awaken the hallowed associations of home, of a mother's and sister's kindness and care, and strike cords of generous feeling in the hearts of the sons of the sea. I would earnestly commend this plan to other institutions and Churches. The cost of furnishing a room will be from \$75 to \$100. Articles and funds for this purpose may be forwarded to the Ladies Seamen's Friend Society, care Ellis & Mitchell, Wilmington. 4. Ladies Scaman's Friend Society of Wilming ton. A Society, embracing ladies of all denomi nations, has been organized for the purpose of furnishing and supervising the Honze. It was deemed inexpedient, however, to commence the work until the Home could be completed, especially as it was so furnished by the Superintendent as to supersede the necessity of an immediate effort by the Society, but now that the Home is in a condition to be thoroughly furnished, they will engage at once in the work, and from what we know of their energy, benevolence and interest in this enterprise, we may confidently expect that the work will soon be done. The will do what they feel they ought to do, and the oppeal to ladies elsewhere to take part in the good work. We hope that other laches will gen crously anticipate the appeal, and commence at once to collect and forward articles and funds to the Society. We would express in behalf of this Society, our thanks to the Ladies of Newburyport, Mass., and Milford, N. H., for the interest they have manifested in this work. 5. Report of the Executive Committee of the Society. This report shows that the cost of the Home and repair, with additional lot, is about fourteen thousand dollars, that the internal repairs are now completed, that it will require for repairs on the outside of the building \$1,000, that indebtedness is \$2,400, that we need for furhishing the Home \$2,000, and for an additional building and furniture for Bethel and Hospital Booms, \$4,500, making in all \$9,900. We have in available subscriptions \$1,500, in the Hospital fund \$2,000, leaving a balance of \$6,400 to be collected. It is necessary to secure this amount to have sufficient room for the sick, and for religious services. And yet the room for Bethel purposes will only be a temporary arrangement until a larger amount can be obtained so as to provide the Bethel itself, 6. Financial Report of Treasurer and Agent.
