From the Chicago Tribune, Jane 11. A Catholic Priest Claiming his Wife in a Court of Justice.

The case of the People ex relatione Nich olas Stamber against Authony Schnieder. which came became before the Court of Compon Pleas of Cook county, Hon John M. Wilson presiding, on Saturday, presents. a curious picture of married life, and reveals some strange practices on the part of the Cabolic clergy, and some, equally strange matters of faith on the part of the more ignorant portion of their flocks

It appears that about a year ago, Nich olas Stamber, then a priest of the Catholic church, was united in marriage with Anna Maria Schnie ler, German grrl, the daughter of the defendant, and a good Catholic The marriage ceremony was performed by Father Peter Krairer, in a private from, without the use of the welding ring, and without witnesses. In all other respects, the marriage ceremony was performed acthe parties agreeing and assenting thereto. promising to be man and wife to each oth er, and the priest giving them the auptial benediction and pronouncing them man

After the ceremony, Father Nicholas took the girl home and kept her as an upper servant or housekeeper, treating her kindly and paying her wages regularly. The girl says berself that although he al ways spoke of her as his wife, the; occupied separate apartments.

Some three months since she left his house and went to Niles, Michigan, where she entered a family in the capacity of a servent. Her own account is, that both her marriage to and desertion from her husband was in accordance with the advice of her parents and friends. To use her language, "she was ta ked into it."

Up to the trace of his wife's leaving him. Father Nicholas had continued his public ministration in the Church, but since then we understand he has been deposed from the priesthood, as has also Father Peter Kramer.

This suit was brought in the chancery side of the Court of Common Pleas, by the husband, to recover possession of his wife, whom he alleged was illegally detained from him by Anthony Schneider The writ issued, commanding Schneider to prod ce the body of Anna Maria before the Court. On Sat rday, the defendant appeared before Hon John M. Wilson, in the Court of Common Pleas, and in obedience to the writ produced the body of his daughter. The husband was also present. For the purpose o' ascertairing the true state of the case, and of finding out what her wishes were in regard to Lying with her husband, the Court or ered the room to be 'cleared of all persons, except the officers of the court, an interpreter, and reporters for the

press, and proceeded to question the girl The husband was informed that the body of his wife had been produced, and that she was here in court; that the magrage, by the laws of Illinois, was perfectly legal and valid, but that he was not to use any force in compelling her to go with him.

We are not, of course, at liberty to disclose all that was then elicted; but it appeared in addition to the bove facts, that she did not consider the marriage legal or binding, because her husband was a priest. that she left her husband of her own accord; and that she wished now to go with her parents and stay with them, and not go with her husband; that the season that she wished to leave her husband was that she had been educated in the belief that she could never go to heaven if she lived in marriage with a priest; but that no threats whatever had been made to her by her parents, by the priests or by the Bishop. She gave her name as Anna Mary Synder, and not as Anna Maria Stamber.

Judge Wilson informed the young lady that the marriage was a perfectly valid and legal one, by the laws of this State, al though it night be a matter of discipline is their own church; and that she could not marry any other min while her husband was hving; but that she was not compelled to live with him; and was asked whom she would go with, her husband or her father? She answered promptly with her father. The doors were then reopened, and her husband and parents, the attorneys on both sides, and the other-mem

bers of the bar re entered. The husband now walked across the room to where the lady stood, and intimated to her his desire that she should go home with him. - But she resolutely refused; nor could all his persuasions inducher to waver from her determination -She left the court with her parents, and the last we saw of the disconsolate spouse, he was following in the wake of his wife. pouring forth his entreaties, to which she turned a deaf ear
