Every one in this valley (of the Hutt) lived in tents for some weeks, as the shocks have continued up to the present time, but none have been so severe as the first. This part for many square miles is rent in every direction; cracks in the ground of many feet in length and from a few inches to several feet deep exist over very large spaces at short intervals from each other. Our horsetrack to the river, which is about half a mile off, has more than twenty such River. across it, twelve of which opened and shut th violence during the shock, and threw water to a considerable height over the surrounding bushes.
