Main and other principal streets at night brightness, lighting up fully the deserted avenues and fashionable promenades mocking as it were the scene of desolation below. Our spacious harbor, smooth as glass, and cleared of vessels, steamers, and sail boats, reflected the brightness and seemed more beautiful than ever. But as we passed along, we heard the distinct words of inconsolable grief attered by the bereaved. Death had been in and struck his blow, the victims had fallen, the re mains had been hastily conveyed away. and sorrowing relatives and friends were weeping, and telling of their loss in words that were full of affection and deep mean ing. We passed on-sad and gloomy that "held us delaying." We mention only one affecting case. On one of the principal streets the windows of the seco d story of a house were all up; lights were burning, and nurses were busy around a bed that stood in sight; and the groans of the dying that fell upon our ear, will per haps never be forgotten.
