The Baltimore Clipper of the 9th inst. says: On Sunday last Bishop Doan delivered a discourse in relation to the recent disaster. In the course of his remarks, he alluded to several friends who had left his residence on the fatal train. Two of them parents, who had just placed their son in his keeping, and who were preserved; the other, a widow, of a clergyman, who was one of the killed. He then portrayed in graphio terms the awful disaster as follows:

"In the midst of life"—all felt—"in the midst of life—we are in death."
