PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 8, 1856.
Rev. and Dear Sir—Your note of inquiry was duly received, and I take pleasure in saying that you were correctly informed as to my acquaintance with Mr. Buchanan, the President elect, and of my favorable opinion of his moral and religious character.

I became personally acquainted with him in the spring of 1842, in the city of Washington, at which time he was, I think, a member of the U. S.
