MISCELLANY. A DIPLOMATIC RECEPTION. We heard on the avenue that Don Antonio de Irujo, Minister Plenipotentiary from Nicaragua to the United States, was to-day formally presented by the Secretary of State to the President, and that his presentation and reception were accompanied by the diplomatic address usual to such occasions.

A TREATY WITH NICARAGUA. A treaty between the United States and Nicaragua was duly signed yesterday afternoon at the State Department by Gen. Cass, on behalf of this Government, and Gen. Irujo, Minister Plenipotentiary, on that of Nicaragua. We have every reason to believe that the leading features of this important convention are correctly stated in the following brief despatch, sent North last evening by the agent of the Associated Press.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 18. There is little if any doubt that a treaty was signed to-day by Secretary Cass and the Nicaraguan Minister, Gen. Irujo, relative to the transit route. The route is to be protected by the United States troops during the inability of Nicaragua to do so, and a free port is guaranteed at each end of the line.
