THIS YEAR'S COTTON MUST BRING 11 CENTS.

Southern Cotton Association Recommends That as Minimum—Crop Estimate of 9,588,133 Bales.

Asheville, N. C., Sept. 7.—The Southern Cotton Association in convention at Kenilworth Inn tonight established a minimum price of 11 cents for the incoming cotton crop.

This action was reached after a four hours struggle in the minimum price committee room this afternoon and a joint secret conference of that committee and the general committee tonight.

It was a contest in which growers, spinners, manufacturers and brokers were involved and one in which the combined influence of all these elements was brought into play.

After the announcement of the estimate of the crop yield of 1905 and 1906, the fight narrowed down to two factions—one holding out for 10 1/2 cents, the other for 11 cents.
