LITTLE KNOWN OF ICELAND.
Southern Coast Rendered Impassable from Sand and Ice.
During the past two years the Danish government has begun a careful topographical survey of Iceland, a work never before undertaken except in a few parts of the island. The least known region is the southern coast, which is impassable in the summer time, owing to the immense quicksands and the inland ice masses pushing down from the mountains. Last spring as long as the frost kept the morasses and grasses in a traversable state, the survey was pushed, and one of its results was to show that the highest point of Iceland is not the Ornea Jökull, as hitherto supposed, but the Hyannadalsknur, the elevation of which is 6,953 feet.—Exchange.

Skeletons Unearthed in Trenches.
A curious discovery has been made in the course of some excavations that have been in progress in St. Martin de Re, in France. The excavators unearthed trenches in which lay skeletons which were presumably those of the citizens who fell fighting there in defending the town against the English in 1627. Among the skeletons was found a spherical iron bomb containing a moist black powder, which was found to consist of about a third of nitre, a third of carbon and a fifth of sulphur, the remainder being iron oxide derived from the rusting of the iron shell.

Widespread Earthquakes.
Some surprise has been expressed at the largeness of the area over which the recent earthquake in the Midlands was felt, considering that the shock at its worst was very slight. But the incident of earth movements produce, as a rule, sensible effects over wide regions. Dr. Charles Davison, F. G. S., who has made a special study of recent earthquakes, computes that the disturbance which shook the city of Birmingham on December 17, 1896, caused tremors over 115,000 square miles. Wales, this estimate being based on 2,302 records from 1,943 places affected. The Inverness earthquake of September 18, 1901, though of only moderate intensity, was felt over an area of 100,000 square miles, about the size of the mountain making forces with violence and producing not only too apparent to the eye, in Scotland, whatever may have happened in former geological epochs, but also in place with almost infinite detail, and hundreds of thousands of years must elapse before such New Zealandly visible features in its march to the sea.—London Telegraph.

World's Biggest Vine.
The largest grapevine in the world is growing in the Carpinteria Valley, 12 miles east of Santa Barbara, Cal., and is called La Para Grande. It was started from a cutting 61 years ago by a young Spanish woman, Donna Azula. It is 8 feet 4 inches in circumference at its base, and one of the horizontal branches measures more than three feet in circumference. The trellis covers about a third of an acre, and 60 heavy posts support it. The vine produces as many as 5,000 bunches annually.

Highest Lake in the World in Peru.
A second steamship is placed in service upon Lake Titicaca, in Peru, the highest lake in the world, 15,000 feet above sea level. There is already one vessel engaged in traffic upon this sheet of water. The latest vessel carries about 500 tons of cargo. It has ample arrangements and facilities for working cargo, and is provided with accommodations for 34 passengers. The dimensions are 120 feet in length by 30 feet beam and 14 feet depth.

To Suppress Coughing.
Portsmouth, England, has passed an ordinance for the suppression of coughing. The ordinance declares that it cannot be suppressed, but the London News says that a partial remedy consists in placing the palm where the cough recurs so high that when he stands up to cough he has to bend his head against the roof and ceiling. A wringing board hung over his head answers the same purpose, it says.

Vigorite is New Explosive.
A new explosive is exploding in Bavaria about ten times as explosively as the most powerful of any would-be rival concoctions, and has been christened vigorite. 
