

"End of all Personal Honor Among Men."

It is known of all men that Senator Vance did not desire the nomination of Mr. Cleveland to the Presidency in 1892. He made no concealment of his views, and in that view most of the delegates from North Carolina to the National Convention shared, for North Carolina only cast 11-2 votes for Cleveland, the others being cast for Stevenson. That big vote from North Carolina for Stevenson for the first place helped to name the popular Illinois man for the second place.

After Cleveland had been nominated, some of the people of North Carolina, who had agreed with Senator Vance, in opposing his nomination, threatened not to vote for him. Replying to these men, Senator Vance in August, 1892, wrote words that will be approved by every true Democrat. (They apply as well in 1910 as they did in 1892, and will be fitting an hundred years hence. Indeed his wise reflections ought to be printed every year so that young men should grow into manhood with correct notions of political honor. Senator Vance wrote: "But an individual preference before the nomination of a candidate is one thing and the duty of a true man after that nomination has been fairly made is another and a very different thing indeed. In the one case a preference may be indulged in properly, without danger to the principles we profess or the party which has those principles in charge; in the other case we endanger both and falsify our pretensions by contributing unduly to the success of our adversaries. If we refuse to abide by the voice of the majority of our fellow-Democrats, freely and unmistakably expressed in friendly convention, there is an end of all associated party effort in government; if we personally participate in that consultation or convention and refuse to abide by the decision of the tribunal of our own selection, then there is an end of all personal honor among men, and the confidence which is necessary to all combined effort is gone forever. The man who bets, promising to collect if he wins and to repudiate it if he loses is in all classes of people considered a dishonest man."

When the Vance standard is departed from there will come an end of struggles for political principles, and also as Vance puts it, an "end of all personal honor among men."
