Road Supervisors Appointed
 North Carolina, Washington County,
 To J. E. Singleton, G. W. Wilson, J. J. Starr and Thomas Leno.
 In accordance with an act of the General Assembly passed on the 21st day of February, 1911, entitled an act "for the working, laying out, repairing, improving and draining the public roads of Washington County," you are hereby appointed supervisor of public roads and bridges in the four townships, Washington County, from this date to the first Monday in December, 1911, subject to the provisions of the above-named act. Your compensation to be \$3.00 per day while actually engaged in the discharge of your duties, not to exceed for the term.
 You are hereby required to make and maintain in your township roads ways free from trees, fences, buildings and other obstructions at least forty feet wide.
 To use no wood, brush, or trash in the making or repairing of any road bed. That the roads where ditches, or drains are cut on the sides, shall be at least twenty-four feet between such ditches, and that no ditch, drain, or cavity, in such road-way shall be more than twelve inches below the crown of the road-way, except drainage ditches crossing the road at right angles. All bridges over ditches must be at least six feet wide, neither above nor below grade, and all railroad crossings above the grade of the public road must be filled for at least fifty feet from the center of track on either side with no grade more than one-third inch to the foot such fills to be at least twenty-four feet wide at the top and so maintained by every railroad having a crossing above the level of the public road, in the above named township.
 During the term of your office you are to have and exercise all the powers and discharge all the duties which by law it is within the power of this board to delegate to you for the purposes of the above act.
