No Cotton Boll-Weevil in North Carolina.

Raleigh. N. C., Oct. 7, 1916. At this season every year farmers find that many cottonbolls are not opening as expected, and in searching for a cause they notice insects or diseases which they have not seen before. Only too often such "discoveries" are reported to local papers are given publicity under suspicion that the "Cotton Boll-weevil" is doing the damage.

Mr. Franklin Sherman. Entomologist in the State Department 6-t of Agriculture at Raleigh wishes to emphasize the fact that whil such reports have been curren each autumn for over twelv years, and while he has ident fied scores of interest sent to hir under suspicion, yet no tru specimen of Cotton Boll-weev has ever yet been taken in th state, and there is no reason t suspect that it is present. disease properly known as An thracnose which causes the boll to rot, has been the real cause of most of the complaints. T Boll-weevil is in the southwest ern third of Georgia, not yet the rest of that state, upr South Carolina, Mr. Sherman says that it will probably be from five to ten years before it reaches the southern border of our state.
