Court Proceedings.

August Term Superior Court for Washington County convened on Monday afternoon with his Honor, John H. Kerr, Judge presiding, and Solicitor J. C. B. Ehringhaus representing the State.

The criminal docket was at once taken up, consuming the entire time of the court until Wednesday afternoon.

The following cases were disposed of:

State vs. Ollie Lynox, larceny, 2 cases, guilty, 6 months on roads.

State vs. Will Hanks, robbery, Nol. Pros.

State vs. Silas Gibbs, f. & a., guilty, 4 months on roads.

State vs. Barney VanHorn, larceny, 2 cases, guilty, 6 mos. on roads.

State vs. Louis Vail, cruelty to animals, not guilty.

State vs. Silas Gibbs and Will Hanks, attempt jail delivery. Defendants plead guilty of attempt to escape jail, 4 months on roads.

State vs. Quincey Overton, larceny, not guilty.

State vs. Walter Perry, a. d. w., guilty, 6 mos. on roads.

State vs. J. L. Bowen, assault, guilty, judgment suspended up on payment of cost.

State vs. Abe Clark and Jackie Norman, f. & a., guilty, 6 mos. on roads as to Clark; judgment suspended as to female deft.

State vs. Harvey Langley and Jennie Langley, attempt abortion. Defendant Harvey Langley enters plea of guilty of assault, plea accepted by the State, fined \$100.00 and costs. The Court enters plea of not guilty as to Jennie Langley.

State vs. Thos. Craddock, Jr., Charlie Craddock and Terry Craddock, abduction, guilty, fined \$50.00 and cost, each to pay one-third of same.

At the termination of the criminal calendar a few divorce and motion cases were heard, and at five o'clock P. M., Wednesday court adjourned sine die for the term.
