BRANCH BANK TO SERVE HERE

Strong Bank To Open Here

The Branch Banking & Trust Company of Wilson, Having Been Appointed Receiver of the United Commercial Bank Will Operate Branch in Plymouth

Following a meeting of depositors and creditors interested Tuesday a committee composed of R. P. Walker, J. R. Campbell and W. A. Swain were asked to go to Tarboro and request of Judge N. A. Sinclair that his court appoint the Branch Banking & Trust Company as temporary receiver for the United Commercial Bank, which closed its doors here last week. The request of the committee was granted and an order issued making the appointment.

It is expected that the new bank will open for business about next Thursday.

The court order follows:

WASHINGTON COUNTY.

In re United Commercial Bank Corporation
Order appointing temporary receiver of United Commercial Bank

This case coming on to be heard by His Honor N. A. Sinclair, Judge presiding in the Judicial District of North Carolina, on the 20th day of January, 1925, upon the complaint herein filed and it appearing to the court that said bank has duly failed and is insolvent and that the assets of said bank are insufficient to pay its debts and liabilities, the court do hereby order that the Branch Banking & Trust Company of North Carolina Corporation, a North Carolina Corporation, is hereby appointed temporary receiver of the United Commercial Bank, the defendant herein, and said temporary receiver is hereby authorized and empowered upon compliance with the terms of this order to take possession of the property and assets of said bank and to sell the same and to distribute the proceeds thereof to the creditors of said bank in accordance with the provisions of the laws of North Carolina in that behalf made.

It is further ordered that the Branch Banking & Trust Company of North Carolina Corporation, as receiver of the United Commercial Bank, shall have the authority to execute all such orders and to do all such things as may be necessary to carry out the purposes of this order and to execute all such orders and to do all such things as may be necessary to carry out the purposes of this order.

property and assets of the said defendant bank as provided by law. And the said Branch Banking & Trust Company having fully complied with the law relating to Trust Companies and being licensed to act as receiver of insolvent corporations, is not required to make bond.

The Sheriff of Washington County will serve this order upon the defendant by delivering a copy thereof, with the proper official of said bank, together with a copy of the complaint herein.

This cause is retained for further and final hearing, as contemplated by law.

CONSIDERING \$35,000.-000. ROAD BILL.

Representative Bowie introduced in the House yesterday a bill to appropriate \$35,000,000 for the State's road-building program. At the same time Senator Heath introduced the same bill in the Senate.

The bill is in accordance with the general road plan as originally worked out and is necessary to fill in the missing links in a number of the leading roads of the State, as well as a number of new projects.

The bill also raises the gasoline tax from 3 to 4 cents per gallon.

The prediction is generally made that the bill will go through without much fight, since people form all sections of the State seem to approve the program.
