NOTICE OF REGISTRATION AND ELECTION

Take notice that an election is hereby called in Washington County to ascertain the will of the people residing in said county on the question of the adoption of the county-wide plan of organization of the schools of said county and on the question of levying a tax sufficient to maintain the schools of said county under said plan and to retire outstanding bonds and interest heretofore issued for school buildings, grounds and equipment, the maximum tax to be levied for said purposes is not to exceed fifty cents on the \$100.00 valuation taxable property and \$1.50 on the poll. Said election will be held on the 26th day of May, 1926, in said county, and all qualified voters may present themselves at the usual polling places in Plymouth, Roper, Skippersville, Scuppernon and Wenaona Precincts for the purpose of casting their votes.

A new registration is ordered for said election and the Registration Books will be opened on the 23rd day of April, 1926, and closed on the 15th day of May, 1926. The following Registrars have been appointed:

Those who desire to vote against said county-wide plan and the tax levy hereinabove mentioned will cast a ballot "Against County-Wide Plan and Uniform County School Tax of Same Rate".

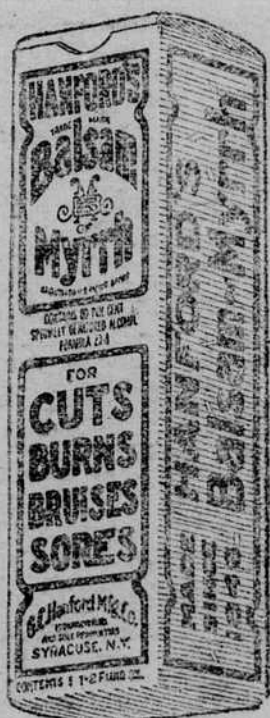
