#### TO REMODEL BANK BLDG.

The local unit of the Branch Banking and Trust Company, with headquarters at Wilson, will remodel and enlarge its present home in this city with an expenditure of about seven thousand dollars. An annex will be added to the rear of the old structure, on the twenty feet space between it and the Harney building. This new structure will enclose the safety deposit vault which will be placed in the building The front will be removed and a double-door opening will be in the entrance instead of the single door as it is now. Many improvements will be made. The new building will contain the old furnishings with additional ones. It will take about fifty days to complete the renovat ing process.
