Total Valuation Reduced Over \$1,300,000; Levy Much Smaller

Simultaneous with the announcement of a rate reduction of 5 cents on the \$100 came the information that a horizontal reduction in valuation of 20 per cent had been declared, it was learned here today from I. Corbitt Swain, accountant of Washington County.
