Political Lines Being Smashed

Political lines are being smashed and their walls are being torn down on many fronts.

Two former Democratic candidates for President have joined up with the main-line Republican policies, while in California the Democrats have nominated Upton Sinclair, an avowed enemy of the army of organized crushing wealth and who stands a hundred per cent behind the Roosevelt principles, was nominated for governor by a large majority. In the same primary, the Democrats joined with the Republicans in the nomination of Hiram Johnson to succeed himself as United States Senator.

If this country is ever saved for honest government the South and West will have to do it, regardless of whether we call ourselves Southern Democrats or Western Republicans, or any other name that we may elect. Such Democrats as Carter Glass and his ilk will never give us a safe democracy.
