Substitute Cod Liver Oil For Green Feed to Poultry

A good grade of cod liver oil that has been biologically tested for potency and vitamin content may be substituted in part for green feed in poultry ration.
One pound or one pint should be added to each 100 pounds of mash when the substitution is made or it may be fed on the grain instead of mixing with the mash when more convenient. Where possible, however, some cured alfalfa hay, lespedeza, or clover hay that retains the green color should be provided for the vitamin content and laxative effects.
