State Has Too Many Boiler Explosions, **Commissioner** Says

Labor Commissioner, Forrest Shuford Urges Inspection Be Made

"Deaths and serious injury, not to mention damage to personal property, from boiler explosions are far too numerous in North Carolina and the total must be reduced," Forrest H. Shuford, State Commissioner of Labor, stated today.

Mr. Shuford made known that two persons had been killed and five others seriously injured as a result of boiler explosions which have occured within the past sixty days. Total property damage from these accidents amount ed to more than ten thousand dollars.

In 1935 the General Assembly enacted a Boiler Inspection Law whish makes it a misdemeanor to operate rigid inspection by State-Commssioned Boiler Inspectors. Only inspectors for insurance companies which operate in this State, and State-employed inspectors are commissioned inspectors, and these men are not issued a commission until they prove their competency by means of a rigid examination and by experience in this particular field. Had boilers which have exploded been inspected, and properly repaired in accordance with not have exploded.

Because of the fact that the State Department of Labor has only one boiler inspector at the present time it is impossible to ferret out every boiler in the state as some of them are located in isolated sections. Inspections are therefore dependent upon incidental location of the boilers, by the inspector, or upon notification by the boiler owner of the location of their boiler. It frequently happens that th first knowledge that the Department has of the location of a boiler is a newspaper report covering an account of an explosion.


'We cannot positively guarantee that an inspection will prevent an explosion," Mr. Shuford stated, "but we do know that the chances of an accident happening are greatly minimized by an inspection. It is interesting to note that not a single boiler inspected by an authorized boiler inspector has exploded since the establishment of the Bureau of Boiler Inspection by the General Assembly Less Assets not admitted of 1935.

"It is my earnest hope that every boiler owner wil cooperate with the State Department of Labor by notifying the Department of the location of any uninspected boilers. If those owning and operating such boilers realize the tremendous danger which they present to life and property, however, I am sure that their cooperfee of from seven to ten dollars provided for by the law will be repaid many times over by thep rotection afforded.'
