The Rev. Mr. Wilson and Mrs. Wilson were welcomed as new members.


It was announced that the Annie W. Armstrong offering program would be held at the church Friday evening, March 20.

During the ceremony of hoisting or lowering the flag, or when the flag is passing in a parade or in a review, all persons present should face the flag, stand at attention and salute.

Those present in uniform should render the right hand salute. Those men not in uniform should remove their headress with the right hand and hold it at the left shoulder, the hand being over the heart.

Women should salute by placing the right hand over the heart.


The salute to the flag in a moving column is rendered as the flag approaches the spectator and is held until it has passed.
