

FARMERS INSURING WHEAT YIELDS



North Carolina farmers are taking advantage of the three-year wheat crop insurance contracts now being offered by the Fedeal Crop Insurance Corporation, according to E. Y. Floyd, state AAA executive assistant, of N. C. State College. The insurance guarantee 75 per cent of the normal yield set up for each wheat farm against loss due to causes beyond control of the grower, such as fire, floods, windstorm, hail and drouth. Premium rates vary from four-tenths to six-tenths of a bushel per acre, which at present prices is an average of about 60 cents per acre. The insurance, however, may be obtained without an outlay of cash, premiums being deducted from any indemnity due the farmer, or any payment due him under the AAA farm program. Closing date for making applications is September 15, and none will be accepted after that date. Applications may be made at any county AAA ofed after that date.
