### Navy Recruiter Here Next Week

Navy recruiters of this area are making a series of regular recruiting visits to cities and towns in Eastern North Carolina each week in an effort to help 17 year-old men secure information regarding enlistment in the Navy or Naval Reserve.

Navy Recruiter D. R. Taylor, of the New Bern station, today urged these young men to investigate the excellent opportunities for advancement in the Navy while serving their country.

Recruiter Taylor will be stationed in Plymouth at the Post Office on Saturday August 7th.

The station in New Bern is also pointing out that recent revisions of the physical requirements for enlistment in the Navy have lowered the physical standards in many instances.

It could not be learned immediately what price range if any would be allowed. Last year, it will be recalled that the price range hardly ever went over 50 cents a pound, but that tobacco of any quality whatever sold way up in the thirties and was fairly stable in the forty-cent range.

In addition to the weighted average of 41 cents per pound for auction sales, the agency established a maximum price of five cents a pound for scrap tobacco, but such purchases are to be included when the average for the season is determined.

### Gasoline Coupons Must Be Endorsed

Users of gasoline, beginning July 22, are liable to lose their gasoline rations if each coupon in their possession is not properly endorsed in ink.

The new policy of coupon endorsements, the secretary said, was taken to assure maximum protection to book holders. Henceforth, motorists will be required to endorse all coupons immediately upon receipt of renewal gasoline rations, so that they will never have unendorsed coupons in their possession.

Endorsement consists of writing in ink on the face of each ration coupon the license number of the vehicle for which the ration was issued and the state in which the car is registered.
