Blood Plasma to War in Pulpwood



THESE BLOOD PLASMA CASES of weather-proof paper board made from pulpwood, shown being delivered by Red Cross workers to a U. S. Navy medical officer, are going to war aboard a battleship. The large cases contain blood donations from twelve Americans; each bottle of blood plasma is in a separate carton, also made from pulpwood, and with it a pint of distilled water. The plasma and water are mixed to make fluid which is saving the lives of our wounded soldiers. Because of the growing shortage, the Government urges farmers and woodsmen to cut more pulpwood—for Victory!

Pulpwood Essential War Material, Head Of WMC Emphasizes

Paul V. McNutt Appeals for Extra Effort During Victory Drive

War Manpower Commissioner Paul V. McNutt recently clarified the attitude of the War Manpower Commission as to the essentiality of pulpwood production in a statement to the Newspaper Pulpwood Committee.

"Pulpwood is an essential war material," he said, "used among other things for making rayon parachutes, shipping containers and smokeless powder."

"Its many wartime uses have created a shortage which is rapidly becoming acute. With these conditions in mind, the War Manpower Commission has recently classified pulpwood cutting and production of pulp as essential war occupations."

"May I urge every man engaged in this essential work, either part or full time, to give it the best he has in him. Let him remember he is wielding his axe and saw in the same struggle and to the same end that other men are welding bayonets and machine guns."

"I know that the men who work in the forests and pulp mills and the farmers who cut pulpwood from their

at the Maritime Union Hall, eager to sign up again. This time they sail on a new Liberty Ship, the "Sea Witch," bound with a convoy for Murmansk. "Action in the North Atlantic" was directed by Lloyd Bacon, who served in the Navy during World War I and is now a Lieutenant-Commander in the United States Naval Reserve.

Pulpwood cutting is now on a revised list of essential activities and has been so specified in a bulletin on forestry, logging and lumbering sent to local selective service boards by the WMC. The cutting of wood, including pulpwood, also is included among the essential farm products listed by the Selective Service as a guide to local boards in the deferment of registrants engaged in agriculture.

As in all such cases, however, the local selective service board is responsible for determining whether a specific registrant's occupation is in support of the war effort. The WMC essential occupation list is the board's guide.
