The census takers are not allowed to engage in any activity or discussions with respondents that is not directly related to the work of obtaining required information. They may not, for example, leave any cards or other literature that does not relate to the taking of the census. "In view of all these restrictions, plus the fact that every employee of the Census Bureau is swarn to secrecy, no one need fear that information given to the census taker in April will be revealed or otherwise misused,"
