

8-Year-Old Boy Dies Result of Fall

James Chester Young, eight-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. James A. Young of 17 Pine Street, Plymouth, died at 5:30 p. m. Wednesday at Washington County Hospital from injuries suffered in a fall from a tree late Tuesday afternoon near his home.

According to reports, the boy was climbing when he fell, breaking his left arm and sustaining internal injuries. The boy was born March 27, 1948, at Montgomery, W. Va., and came to Plymouth with his family about two years ago.

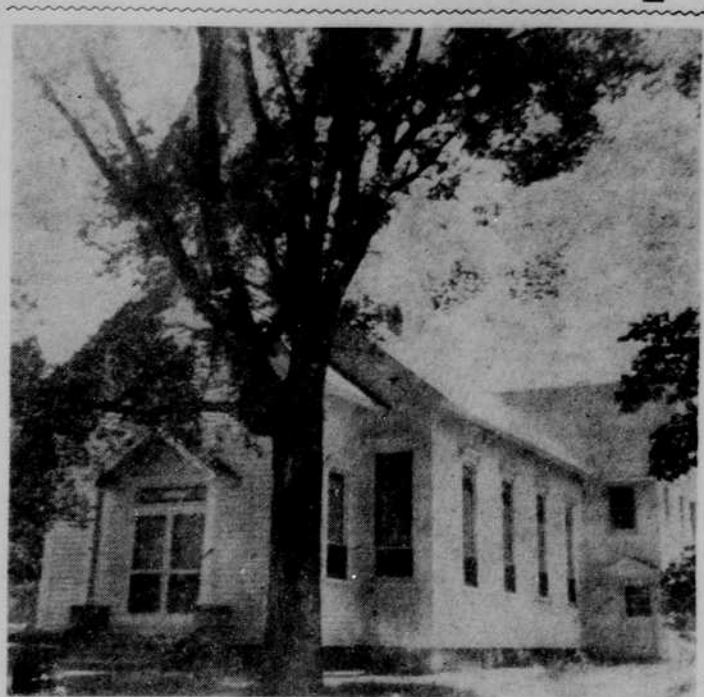
