Auditor J. J. Cole told a story yesterday about a man calling a newspaper office and telling the social editor that he was the father of triplets.

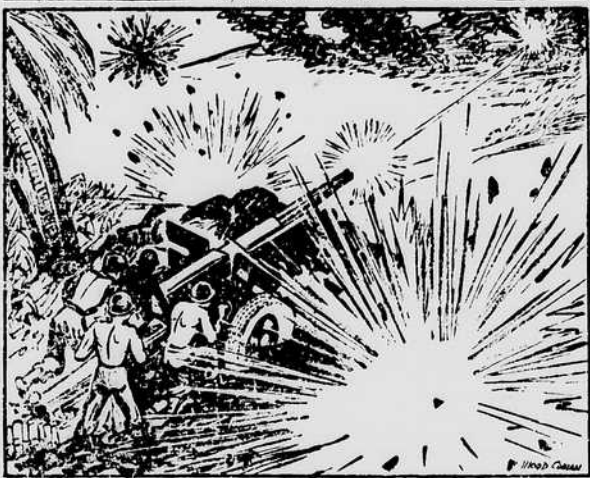
Tsgt. Marvin Philyaw of Comfort arrived home early Thursday morning after 39 months overseas with the 7th Army.

Guam—(AP)—The thinning Japanese garrison on Southern Okinawa has been cut into two segments, with most enemy forces retreating from the Jaegu plateau.

Advance On Luzon

Manila—(AP)—U. S. Sixth Army troops, spearheaded by the hard-hitting 37th Infantry Division, Monday slammed rapidly northward on Luzon in a bid for an early cleanup of weakening Jap resistance.

Ill Industrial Targets

Guam—(AP)—Four of Japan's smaller war industrial cities have been set afire in pre-dawn raids by 450 American superfortresses which caught the enemy by surprise but met extremely accurate anti-aircraft gunfire over the target.
