Is Recommended For Winter Lawns Locally

Several requests have been received recently for seeding winter lawns. Italian Rye Grass makes an excellent winter lawn and should be seeded immediately. It can be seeded directly on top of the already established lawn and raked in and should be thoroughly watered, also should be fertilized with a fertilizer, such as 5-7-5. Heavy rye grass stands will weaken the condition of the summer lawn. A Bermuda grass lawn will stand up better than most other type lawns, however, it will be weakened some. Therefore, the rate of seeding ahould be ¼ to ¾ pounds per 1,000 square feet of lawn. The heavier rates to be applied on Bermuda grass lawns. This grass should be mowed often and close throughout the winter and spring to enable the summer grasses to get a good start. "Heroic achievement in action on April 9, 1945, near Scheelruth, Germany, When his light machine gun squad was engaged in the attack of heavily defended enemy positions, Pfc. Horne continuously exposed himself to heavy enemy rifle and machine gun fire while bringing ammunition to the weapon. Despite the heavy fire directed against him he persisted in his duty until he was mortally wounded after having made several trips between the ammunition supply point and the gun position. His performance kept the weapon in action, thus playing a vital role in the capture of the village.

Early in January the Rainbow Division aided in repulsing the last frantic efforts of the German army to smash back into France through Alsace in bitter fighting north of Strasbourg, at Hatten and Rittersoffen and along the Moder River in the vicinity of Haguenau. In March it began its drive into German army, which was halted only by the unconditional surrender of the German army.
