City Asks 11 P. M. Curfew In Jacksonville Be Lifted

Upon the request of Jacksonville business men, the city board of commissioners Friday night adopted a resolution asking Camp Lejeune to lift the 11 p.m. curfew.

The action, on motion of Commissioner J. C. Collins, seconded by Commissioner B. J. Holleman, coincided with a request of the Jacksonville Chamber of Commerce that it be lifted.

Marine officials were said not to have cherished the idea of a curfew for Jacksonville at any time. When it is lifted, military police will be in the city all night.

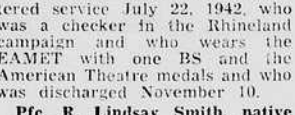

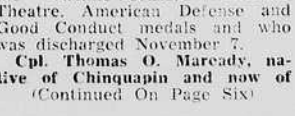

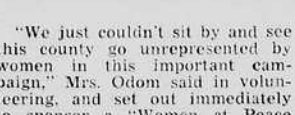
