IMPORTANT NEWS THE WORLD OVER

Happenings of This and Other Nations For Seven Days Are Given.

THE NEWS OF THE SOUTH

What is Taking Place in the Southland Will Be Found in Brief Paragraphs.

Domestic. Atlanta, Ga., Augusta, Ga., Ayre, Mass., El Paso, Texas, and American Lake, Texas, have been designated by the war department as training camps for the armies to be sent to Europe. Alabama must supply 8,000 men to the regular army from the National Guard. Florida must send 3,200 men from the National Guard to the regular army. M. E. Cantillon, president of the Minneapolis club of the American Association, says that there is a strong probability that there will not be a minor league in operation by July 4, except perhaps some of the larger minors. A big baseball official says that salaries paid baseball players in the last three or four years have practically bankrupted the industry, and that unless there is retrenchment the game is doomed. It has been formally announced that American destroyers have carried the flag into the submarine war zone, but the number of vessels is not disclosed. Slackers who seek to evade registration for the war army can be detected easily. The list of registrations will be posted, and all citizens who know of evasions are expected to report them. The war department says that failure to register for war service not only stamps a man as a coward, but is a misdemeanor and renders one liable to imprisonment. The raises contemplated in the army are: Those receiving \$15 to \$21 a month, an increase of \$15 per month; those receiving \$24, an increase of \$12; those receiving \$30, \$36 or \$40, an increase of \$8, and those receiving \$45 or more, an increase of \$6. Major General Pershing is reported to favor the plan of training the United States army in the South during the winter months. Lieut. Melchior Ebert, United States army aviation corps, was killed by a fall with his airplane during a flight at Columbus, N. C., according to a telegram received at divisional headquarters here. The Pittsburgh police have recovered practically all of the ten thousand dollars taken from the First National bank of Castle Shannon, a suburb of Pittsburgh, by four bandits, who entered the bank, shot to death the cashier and assistant cashier of the bank, bound and gagged a patron of the bank and, in attempting to escape, wounded two other persons. The war department apprehends that registration and selective draft are being confounded. These are separate and distinct processes. Registration is simply enrollment of males of certain ages, between 21 and 30. Selective draft is taking those who can best be spared for the service of the country.

Washington

Following the signing of the selective draft war army bill by the president and the issuance of a statement to that effect, in which the president states that the success or failure of the United States' entry into the world-war will fall upon him, the president announced that he could not employ volunteers or avail himself of the "fine vigor and enthusiasm" of former President Roosevelt for the expedition which the colonel wanted to take into France. The president gives other reasons for turning the Roosevelt plan down, among which is that the army cannot spare the officers the colonel wanted in his division, and that the army that makes this fight must be composed of younger men. The new army law provides for an ultimate force of approximately two million men to back up the first troops to go to the front. The president issues a proclamation calling upon all men in the country between the ages of 21 and 30, inclusive, to register themselves for military service on June 5 next. Secretary McAdoo has established a credit of \$45,000,000 for Belgium, the sum to be withdrawn in monthly installments of \$7,500,000 each. The food control bill will most likely be the next war measure taken up by both houses of congress. The shipbuilding provisions to the war budget measure are supplemented by the senate committee with provisions for federal commandeering of ship yards, factories and other facilities. The United States government has issued a warning to the Cuban people against interference with the sugar production, and declares that unless all those under arms against the government of Cuba return home immediately, the United States may find it necessary to deal with them as enemies. It will not be long before the war department will have completed comprehensive plans for raising a force to fight Germany, in view of the fact the war army bill will become a law shortly.

Fourteen British drifters have been sunk in a raid by Austrian light cruisers in the Adriatic sea. Austrian warships sent the British cruiser Dartmouth to the bottom by way of the torpedo route. British troops in Macedonia have made important advances on the Doiran front and captured the village of Klapri on the Struma front. Queenstown cablegrams announce that a squadron of American torpedo boat destroyers has safely crossed the Atlantic and is now patrolling the seas in actual war service. The British admiralty announces that the United States' entry into the war zone has already been productive of a brush between a destroyer and a German underwater boat. When the American torpedo destroyer squadron arrived in Queenstown, a crowd of several hundred carrying tiny American flags lined the water front and cheered the destroyer from the moment the flotilla was first sighted till it reached the dock. The report of the losses through submarines for the week ending May 15 is the most favorable in many weeks. The number of ships torpedoed is well below the average, while the number of ships escaping is very large. The German chancellor says that if Russia renounces her aims of conquest, Germany will not prevent a permanent friendship by making impossible demands. The Italians have assumed the offensive against the Austrians in the Isonzo region along a front of nearly twenty-five miles.
