Air Resistance in Tunnels.

When a train goes through a tunnel the resistance of the air is an important factor, experiments having demonstrated that it measures 13.86 pounds per ton of train weight in the Shiplon tunnel, as against only 8.5 pounds in the open air, a difference of over 50 per cent. This is when the train is running at 37 miles an hour in the direction of the ventilating air current; when running in the opposite direction the resistance increases to 20.40 pounds.

Attar of Roses.

Attar of roses, which is an oil, is obtained from three species of wild roses: *Rosa centifolia*, *R. moschata*, and *R. damascena*. The rose gardens at Ghazipur, India, have long been famous for their output of oil of roses. All these roses thrive with little care in California.
