**NOW FOR COMMUN-**ITY ORGANIZATION

Thru long years of earnest endeavor and varied hardships the country school has been struggling to serve the needs of the communityto bring to the community something of education, culture, ideals, and standards of rural life-and the educational policy of the present demands this service of the schools to a fuller degree now than ever before, but the deplorable lack of results along these lines has led us to cast about for the cause, and, as a result, is leading to a readjustment of our conception of what constitutes true education, culture, ideals, and standards in the rural community. The efficient rural school of the immediate future is one which shall train the youth for actual citizenship, and will strive, also, to develop a higher standard of rural community life. The agricultural, the health, the social, and the moral phases of community life must be developed as well as the educational (Term used with reference to school life). The school is the main agency for accomplishing this, but it can't accomplish all of it working alone. It must have the cooperation of the forces of the community, the hearty support and guidance of all the county leaders, and, last, and most important, of all, a teacher who hears the call of social service. The call of the present to teachers is to make the school an actual community center for all wholesome purposes, and thru the school as an agency to build toward organized community life. To do this the rural teacher must gradually become a new type of teacher-one "familiar with all kinds of rural industry, one trained to interpret life and nature in terms of both utility and beauty-a person trained to interpret words in terms of action."

Many teachers are approaching this new type and stand ready to advance to the next mile post of progress which has to do with actual community organization. Already, they have sensed the need of this sort of organization as a supplement to their school endeavors, but lack of time for thinking out a definite policy and program of activities for such an organization has impeded their prog-

NOTES ON CLUB WORK IN TRAN-SYLVANIA COUNTY

Lake Toxaway, Oct. 22.—At a meeting of the girls' home demonstration club held this morning at Lake Toxaway school, a resume of the work done by the club since its organization last May, was taken, and, following the presentation of plans for the winter course by the county home demonstration agent, a course consisting of educational and practical sewing and of cooking lessons based on a study of the value and importance of milk in the daily diet of every growing child, with special reference to preparing milk dishes suitable for school lunches, was adopted by the club. At this meeting Miss Annie Raines was elected to succeed Miss Jessie Gillespie as secretary and treasurer, who was forced to resign because of other work.


A special meeting of the ladies of the Lake Toxaway community is being arranged for the purpose of organizing a separate Woman's Home Demonstration Club. This meeting is to be held at the Red Cross rooms on the afternoon of Wednesday Nov. 5th, and every lady in the community is urged to be present.

Quebec, Oct. 22 .- The enterprising home demonstration club of Quebec held its regular meeting at the school house this afternoon. After a summary of the splendid achievements of this club, since its organization six months ago, was made for the use of the county home demonstration agent in making her annual report to Washington, it proceeded to adopt a program of club activities for the winter months. This program contemplates a course of educational sewing, supplemented with dress-making for the older girls, and an inter

esting study of milk and milk products in their relation to the needs of growing children. It will be attempted to make milk in some form an integral part of the school lunch of every child in this school, as well as in all the other schools associated with club work.

In the meantime, the twenty-seven girls and young ladies constituting the membership of this club will lend their energies toward increasing their efficiency as expert canners and enlarging the equipment of the little community cannery crected recently, largely thru their united efforts. It is the purpose of these girls to do a splendid business next year in standard commercial canning. An excellent beginning along this line was made this year, although it was not their organized purpose to attempt any work except their own products

Davidson River, Oct. 23 .- The home demonstration club at Davidson River school has renewed its efforts with the return of its splendid corps of teachers, who are giving a measure of co-operation in the promotion of club work seldom found to the same extent in North Carolina. At the regular meeting of the club here today, the girls, working under the direction of the county home demonstration agent, made and serv; ed boiled custard, as a demonstration of one way in which milk may be utilized in the preparation of school lunches. They also had preliminary astruction for the course of educational sewing which they expect to devote themselves to this winter under the direction of the county agent. On the alternate Thursdays when the agent does not come to the school, Misses Deaver and Bell of the faculty will have lessons in sewing with a view to teaching the girls how to make Christmas gifts. Davidson River school is taking the lead in industrial training in the county.


