AN UNUSUAL INVESTMENT BILL

A legislative member stopped another on the street this week and asked if the crop estimates reports were not taking advantage of farmers. farmers have thought so. Now what is the true situation? The agricultural Statistician in charge of the Cooperative State and Federal work, has offered some ideas worth consid-life that we are blessed that we may

If information were available that warranted closer buying and higher prices for farm products, farmers and business interests would prosper more. It is the skeptic or the pessimistic class who would have us re-

The speculators have their own privete sources of crop information, but they have to use it for best advantage prior to the issuance of the government reports, since they stabilize tenncies. The basis of all valuable form information is that of the crop

A bill has been introduced by Senator Varser providing for this essential basis. By dependable information available to all interests, the ques tion of uncertainties is minimized. Senator Varser's bill simply proposes that the acreages of crops planted each year be secured thru the tax listers, the results to be turned over to the department of Agriculture who will tabulate and publish the information after the crops are harvested. This was tried voluntarily and very successfully for two years by 93 counties. It has been approved by all who understand it, and farmers want such information as will aid them in planning for their next

The idea of economy is prevalent in this bill. The blanks and tabulations are paid for by the department c Agriculture and the tax listers have to be paid any way. The final information is sent all over the State and is free to those who request it.

Thru reliable information one learns what other counties, as well as his own, are doing; markets for buying and selling are located; settlers are given opportunity for studying counties; and teachers can instruct intelligently about local crops. Enlightenment aids while ignorance retards prosperity.

Listen to this: A farmer said that this information last year saved him over \$800. It is estimated to result in five per cent better prices to the farmers and lower prices to the consumer; but even at one per cent increase in farm prices, it would mean over \$3,000,000 saved annually to the North Carolina farmers alone. A good investment bill, isn't it?
