METHODIST DOINGS:
(By Rev. A. S. Raper)

The Christian Education Movement of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, has an allotment of one million dollars in its budget as an aid fund to educate boys and girls for Christian life service.

Other churches have shown Southern Methodists the way and revealed the priceless value of help to worthy men and women whose lives have been ennobled for high service for their fellowmen. The Presbyterian churches have hundreds of thousands of dollars in their loan funds transformed each year into brain power, spiritual energy and moral fiber, the money returning regularly into the treasury to fare forth again through the years on its mission of light and liberation.

The Methodist Episcopal Church has made loans to 23,952 of her students, amounting to more than \$2,500,453. To date, more than \$600,000 has been returned, and these returns are coming back at the rate of \$50,000 per year.

The M. E. Church, South, was among the first of Protestant denominations to recognize the value of woman's ability and service, and the last general conference bestowed on her equal privileges of the church with its male members. In the Christian Education Movement, Mrs. J. H. McCoy, the widow of the late Bishop McCoy, a woman of unusual spiritual force, high culture and refinement, has been given a prominent place in the Educational Commission. She has a seat in all the conferences and her counsel is sought in shaping their plans.

Realizing this, Southern Methodist women organized to promote Christian homes and Christian leadership in the varied lines of endeavor, and were among the founders of organized Christian work. Every phase of missionary, Christian and vocational education for women is incorporated in the work accomplished by the Woman's Missionary Council of the M. E. Church, South, of which Miss Belle Bennett, LL. D., is president. The achievements of this organization have been marvelous. This organization not only trains leaders for Christian service, but it has founded institutions for this education and has supported them.

Prominent among these institutions is: The Brevard Institute at Brevard, N. C., which Institute is to receive from the educational drive, \$140,000.

The mission of Methodism has always been to teach, and the Christian Educational Movement will make it possible to reach a larger number of young men and women who will devote their lives to various forms of Christian activities.

A preacher founded Harvard. Of the first 119 colleges in America, 104 were Christian colleges. Christian education is the distinctly American idea. The Southern Methodist Church believes that to depart from this idea is to depart from Americanism.
