DYPHTHERIA TOXIN

ANTI-TOXIN. Having had a communication from the State Board of Health expounding the virtues of prophylathic treatment and prevention of diphtheria and being interested in this subject we have consulted our local physicians and find that we have a few people who have been progressive enough to have had their children already vaccinated.

Toxin anti-toxin, when properly given, is a preventive for diphtheria for life. The New York State Board of Health, which is the finest in the United States, used toxin antitoxin first seven years ago and those children who were given toxin antitoxin have been tested every year since, the test being negative, in other words these children are not susceptible. Practically all children between the ages of six months and eight years are susceptible to diptheria if exposed.

Anyone desiring to know whether or not they are susceptible to diptheria should consult a physician and be schick tested.

Attention has been called to this subject by Dr. Wallis in these collumns. Additional literature has been published by the State Board of Health and too much emphasis cannot be given to the fact that diphtheria is preventable.




