RESOLUTIONS OF THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN

At the regular meeting of the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Brevard, all the members being present and participating, the following resolution was unanimously passed and ordered spread upon the records: Whereas, it has come to the knowledge of this body that the Board of County Commissioners of this county has discontinued the employment of both the Farm and Home Demonstrators of this county, and that, too, without notice to either of said Demonstrators, or to the public interested in their work; And whereas, this board believes that the work done by these departments in the past and its extension already planned for the immediate future is of the highest benefit to the vital interest of the town and county; Be it resolved that this body deeply deplore the unexpected and sudden action of the County Commissioners, and respectfully urge them to reconsider said action, believing that the small portion of the expense for this work contributed by the county will be cheerfully borne by nine tenths of the tax payers of the county, and will be repaid in the future a hundred fold.

The Board of Aldermen is fully justified in their action in this matter as it firmly believes that the growth and progress of the town depends upon the growth and progress of the agricultural interests of the county, which the work of these demonstrators encourages and fosters. Be it further resolved that these resolutions be published in the Brevard News and that a copy be sent to the County Commissioners. Correct copy;
