

ROADSIDE TREES

It is generally assumed that the elm or ash or maple which shades the highway has no utilitarian value. It is, in fact, detrimental to the farmer whose land it occupies. Both because of its shade and because of its spreading roots it necessitates the excavation from cultivation of a narrow strip of earth. In those days when intensive farming is preached so assiduously it is not fair to berate a farmer who cuts down a row of stately wayside trees. Yet the loss is so irreparable that some means ought to be devised for saving the trees. The suggestion of a bonus for property owners who maintain shade trees which benefit the traveling public is probably impractical, says the Cleveland Plain Dealer. In America we have not yet reached the stage of development where we are willing to pay out public money for benefits purely esthetic. The only effective campaign in behalf of our roadside trees must be based on the appeal of altruism. The owner must be convinced that the good he does to others more than counterbalances whatever personal loss he may sustain.

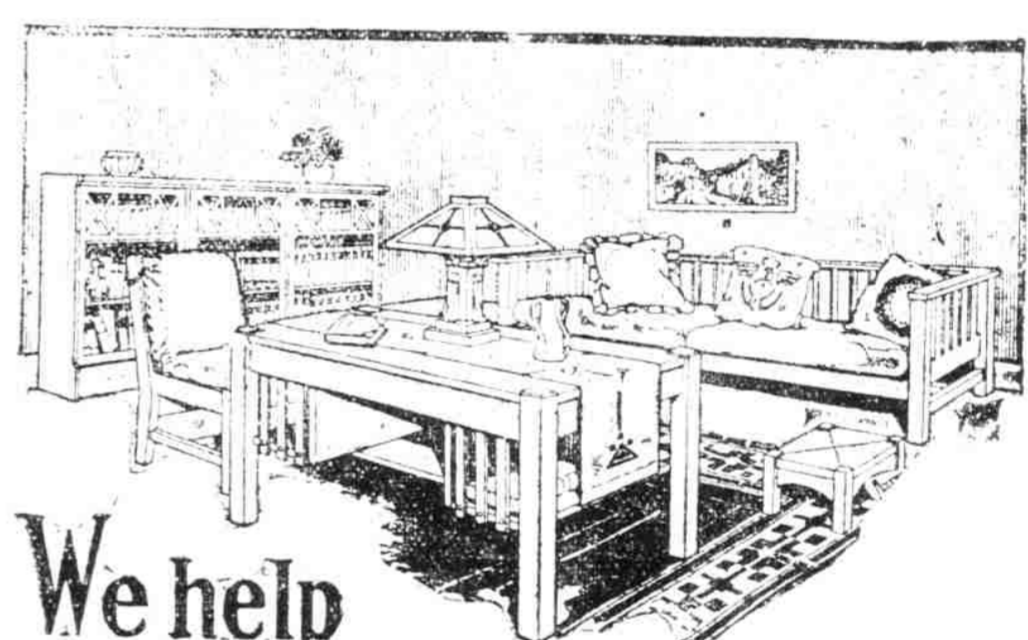
