Bad judgment and faulty navigation on the part of three officers caused the loss of 23 lives and of naval material to the value of \$13,000,000 in the destroyer accident on Honda Point, Calif., September 8, the board of inquiry declared in its final report to Secretary Denby. On the recommendation of the board Captain Edward H. Watson, the squadron commander; Lieutenant Commander Donald T. Hunter, commanding the Delphy, flagship of the nine destroyers which grounded, and Lieutenant Lawrence E. Blodgett, navigator of the Delphy, will be charged before a general court martial with "culpable inefficiency in the performance of duty" and negligence.

Executives of the grain and coal hauling railroads through a committee selected at their meeting in New York will present to the Interstate Commerce commission their answer to President Coolidge's suggestions relative to reductions in freight rates on export wheat and on coal for shipment to Canada.

An appeal to the 150,000 Christian ministers of the country to help the American people "secure an intelligent and understanding of the nature and work of the permanent court of international justice" has been issued by the federal council of churches through its commission on international justice and good will.

Testifying at the senate public lands committee's investigation of the leasing of the Tropic Dome, Wyoming, naval oil reserve to the Hays, E. Sinclair interests, former Secretary Fall, of the interior department, told of his business relations with Sinclair since his resignation from the cabinet last spring.

Domestic—

The federal grand jury returned an indictment charging use of the mails to defraud investors against seven members of four New York brokerage concerns.

A white man who gave his name as Leo Wiley, of Manistee, Mich., died in a Columbia, S. C., hospital after having been found on a lumber car of a railway train suffering from injuries by a piece of timber falling on him. A telegram addressed to the chief of police of Manistee, brought response that Wiley was not known there.

On a deputy was killed when rioting broke out in the slum district of the city of Mexico when the Hines and Callahan forces clashed in the slums. Guillermo Zúñiga, a supporter of Francisco de la Huerta, former secretary of the treasury, was killed.

Arnold Fiesel's forces and Adolf Hitler and Hermann Goebbels moved on the Thüringen border. Smaller, mostly the federal cabinet in Berlin was confronted with a Socialist demand that Chancellor Brüning apologize for clearing Swabian ministers from office. Socialists in the federal cabinet threatened to quit unless the apology was made.

French official circles in Paris indicate their expectation that a final accord with the British government regarding the condition under which the proposed committee of experts will examine Germany's capacity to pay will be reached within a short time, and that the reparations commission may go ahead with the arrangement already made.

The national assembly at Ankara has voted the establishment of the Turkish republic. Mustafa Kemal Pasha has been unanimously elected president. The assembly accepted the constitutional amendments proposed without opposition and loudly cheered the Turkish republic.

Europe is to make another effort to unravel the everlasting reparations tangle. The British government has decided to accept the French premier's reservations and the British charge d'affaires at Washington has been instructed to inform Secretary Hughes of the decision of the powers to enter a conference of experts such as was recently suggested by Mr. Hughes.

Washington—

Charges that Charles R. Forbes while director of the veterans' bureau still was seeking as late as September, 1922, to surreptitiously remove large stocks of narcotics and liquors from the government hospital at Perryville, Md., were made at the continuation of the investigation of the veterans' bureau.

One vacancy in the senate and ten in the house remain to be filled before the convening of congress. In most cases the contests will be decided on November 6, the general state election day. The senate seat vacant is that formerly occupied by the late William P. Dillingham, Republican, Vermont, former representative Porter H. Dale, Republican, and Park H. Pollard, a first cousin of President Coolidge, but a Democrat, are the contestants for this place.

Fully convinced that the coming reparations inquiry will open the avenue to a settlement of Europe's paramount problem, President Coolidge and Secretary Hughes are now chiefly concerned with the details of the new venture.

Final settlement in the case of Private George Dilboy, of Massachusetts, whose body was reported to have been desecrated by Turkish soldiers at Alachata, Turkey, while it rested in a casket covered by an American flag, was announced by the state department.
