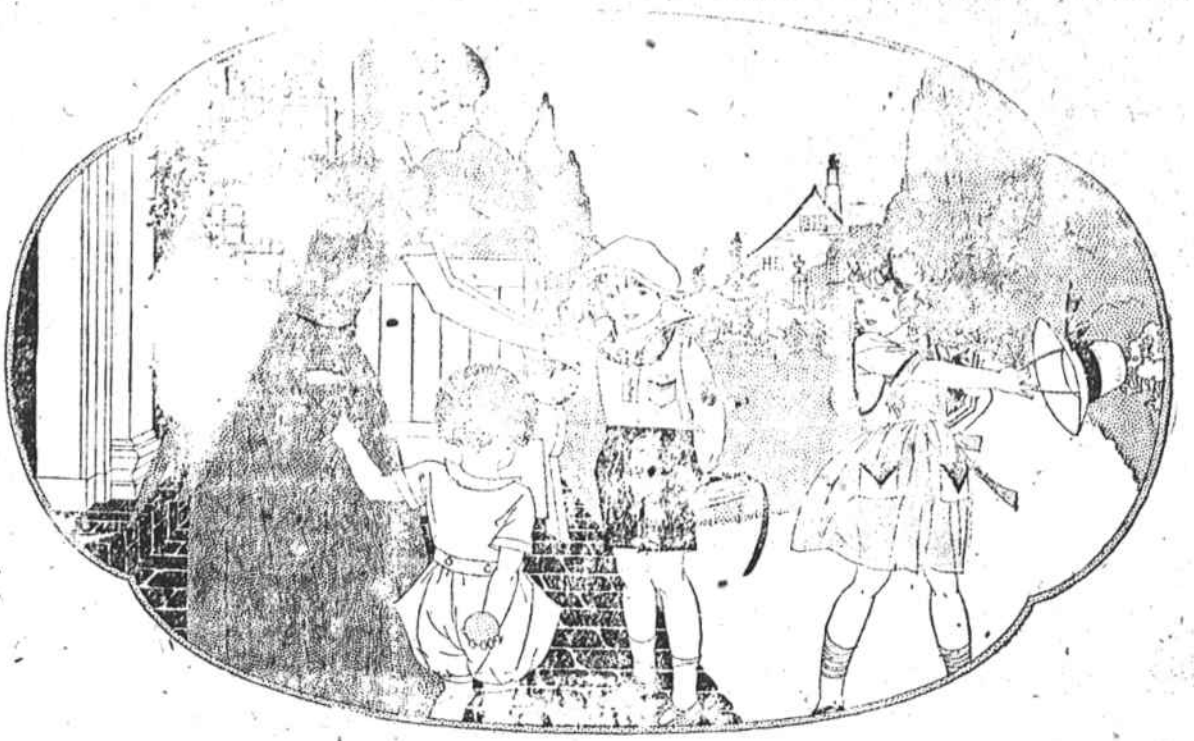
NOTICE OF SUMMONS BY PUBLICATION
