Ordinance

Be it ordained by the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Brevard, N. C. that it shall be unlawful for any person, unless he is authorized by the manager or chief of the Fire Department of the Town of Brevard, or some member of the Fire Department, to drive or attempt to drive the Fire Truck belonging to said town, or to get on said truck at any time or place; and any person or persons so offending shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined not more than \$50.00 or imprisoned not more than thirty days, in the discretion of the Mayor.

Ordinance

Be it ordained by the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Brevard, N. C. that all persons, other than members of the Fire Department, who may be driving any automobile or other vehicle on any of the public streets of the town of Brevard, shall, at the sound of the "Fire Whistle" or the Fire Bell, park their vehicle in such a place and manner as not to interfere in any way with the passage of the FIRE TRUCK or automobile carrying members of the Fire Department until the exact location of the fire is ascertained.

Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined not less than \$25.00, or imprisoned not more than thirty days in the discretion of the Mayor.

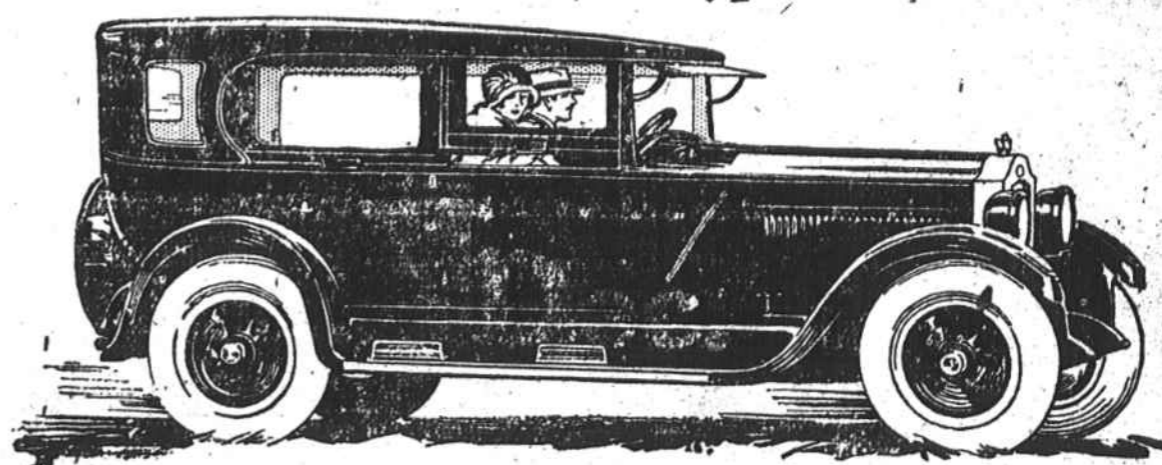
