MR. CHARLES E. NEILL DIES IN GREENVILLE

The many friends in Transylvania County of Mr. Chas. E. Neill will be saddened at reading the following notice from the Greenville News of January 9th.
Mr. Neill formerly lived in Transylvania County and has many friends and relatives in this County. He was a man of high character, a true friend and a fine citizen and his death is a loss to the community in which he lived.

"Chas. E. Neill, for many years a resident and well known business man of this city, but more recently engaged in business in Westminster and Seneca, died at 2:00 o'clock Wednesday afternoon at the home of his brother, R. D. Neill in Seneca, after a sudden illness of pneumonia. He was 70 years of age.

"He is survived by his wife Mrs. C. E. Neill of this city and one daughter, Mrs. A. C. Clark, of Boston, Mass., and two sons, Jesse C. Neill of Birmingham, Ala., and Barry Neill of Atlanta. One brother R. D. Neill of Seneca also survives.
