PUBLIC WARNED OF COUNTERFEITS

Dodge Brothers Analysis Shows Imitation Service Parts Are Usually Defective

Dodge Brothers contend that the buyer is the victim of misrepresentation in either case.

The results of a long series of tests in the Dodge Brothers laboratories indicate that the motorist is not only fooled, as a general rule, when he pays out good money for counterfeit parts, but that he sometimes places himself in actual danger.

For example, a genuine Dodge Brothers rear axle shaft withstood six complete turns in a twisting test, while the best of several counterfeit shafts withstood only 1-3-4 turns. Again, a genuine steering knuckle

bolt bent almost double, without breaking, when put under tremendous pressure. When the same test was applied to a counterfeit knuckle bolt, it snapped in two immediately.

"Such tests show very plainly that it is dangerous to use counterfeit parts," said J. A. Smith, local Dodge Brothers Dealer. "The least that can be said for such parts is that they are a source of endless expense and inconvenience to the man who is unfortunate enough to have them in his car. The worst that can be said is that they actually jeopardize the safety of passengers. Every man and woman who ever drove a car can readily appreciate what might happen if a vital part should give way on a hazardous grade, or in a crowded street crowded with swiftly moving traffic."

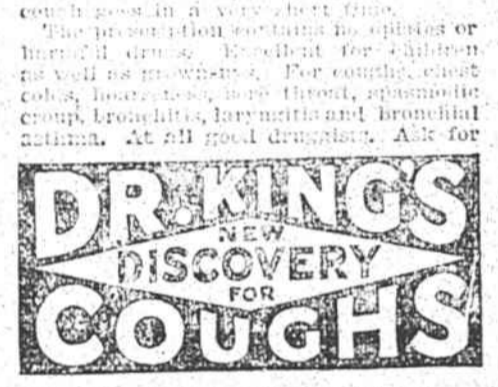
