CITIZENS MUST OBSERVE FIRE TRUCK ORDINANCE

Mayor and Fire Chief agree not to prosecute offenders of Ordinance at this time, but offenders hereafter will be prosecuted.

As usual, when the fire alarm sounded Monday, automobiles ran in front of, and hindered the progress of the fire truck. This habit will, unless broken, cause serious damage at some time. Ordinances have been passed providing fines of not less than twenty-five dollars or imprisonment of not more than thirty days for those offending these laws.

All vehicles are required to park on the sound of the alarm, in such a manner as not to interfere with the progress of the fire truck.

An ordinance also provides that no person shall drive, or attempt to drive, or get on the fire truck except he be a member of the fire department or is authorized by the fire chief to do so.

Should another fire occur, and either of these ordinances be broken, the offenders will probably realize that there is some provision whereby they may be reminded of their mistake.
