The Valley shipped this year over 13,000 solid carloads of vegetables and will ship over 100,000 bales of cotton. They have already picked and shipped the first bale of cotton this year. The orange and grapefruit groves were the prettiest places that I have ever seen, with all kinds of pretty flowers and green grass.
