The World war served to demon strate that the tyranny of the diseaseproducing germ can be conquered.

Straining every nerve for victory the nations that faced the foe from Bagdad to Bruges had to make sure that epidemie disease should not attack the firing line from the rear. Consequently, half-way and temporizing methods were taboo and preventive medicine had free reign.

The results were amazing, Although never before in human his tory was there such an intermingling of peoples, such a crossing and recrossing of seas, such an invitation to contagion to spread to the ends of. the earth, only one epidemic succeeded in breaking the barriers erected by the sanitarians. And, as if to emphasize man's power to master the major contagions, not one of those with which the world's public health officials were familiar escaped from the regions where it was endemic, while influenza, which was a stranger, broke away and swept over the face. of the earth.

It was hatural, therefore, that when peace came again the lessons of prevention and sanitation learned during the World war should have driven themselves home in the minds of those who think in terms of world welfare: Taught that epidemic diseases, which plainly constitute the major menace. to civilization in peace times, can be mastered, the sanitarians threw themselves into the fray with redoubled
