Southern's branches, Athens to Lula, Ga., and Elberton to Toccoa, Ga., and also from Washington, D. C.

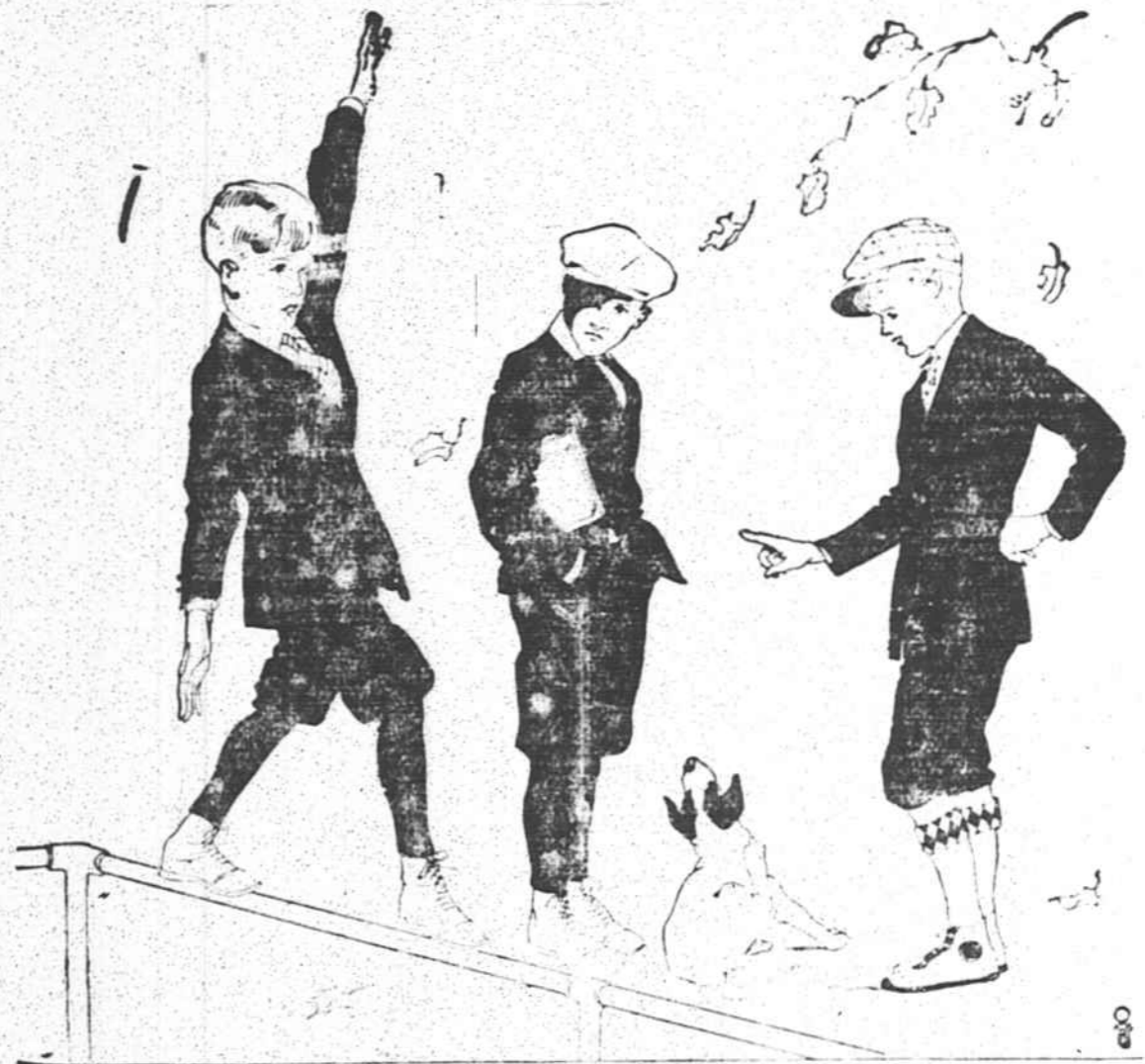
Tickets may be purchased during the period September 20th-October 3rd with final limit of October 5th.

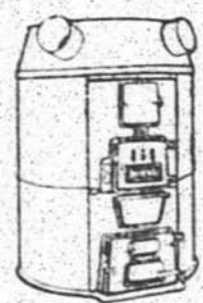
