

SEVENTY FIVE MILES OF PAVEMENT LAID LAST MONTH

Figures compiled in the Construction Department of the State Highway Commission show that 75.55 miles of paving were laid during September. This does not quite equal the mileage laid in August when 84.23 miles were laid. The pavement laid last month was divided as follows: Concrete paving 40.21 miles; concrete base course 15.82 miles; asphalt concrete surfacing 12.48 miles; sand asphalt 7.04 miles. In September, 1924, 43.66 miles were laid as follows: concrete paving 19 miles; concrete base course 7.0 miles; asphaltic concrete surfacing 3.45 miles; sand asphalt 14.21 miles.
