ABOUT WOMEN

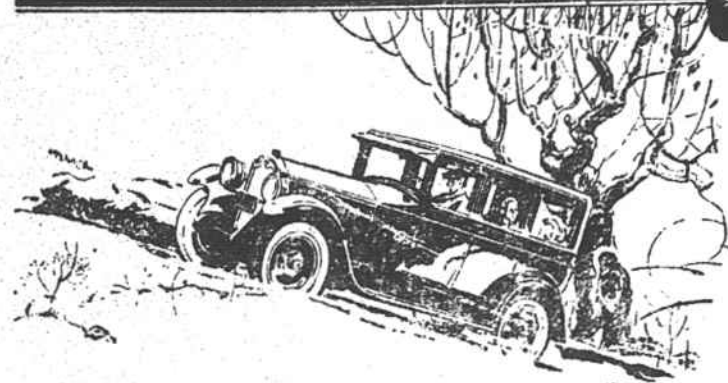
