What and when is the Clean Up and Paint Up campaign?



Heart-rending descriptions are given of the horrible plight of the thousands of flood victims, with new victims being claimed every day on account of the rapidly rising waters. Reports state that many of the refugees are huddled on levees without shelter or food, while others are perched on houstops and in trees, and even some, in their pitiable attempts to save their lives, are said to hang from the limbs of trees and wire fences, and forced to endure untold hardships.
